


CREDITON HAMLETS PARISH COUNCIL

The very poor state of roads in the Parish was again discussed at the January Crediton Hamlets Parish Council meeting, with particular mention of Moorlake. All present expressed frustration at the lack of action from DCC, despite frequent reporting of issues and complaints. DCC had responded to complaints about Moorlake, saying that the problem was due to upwelling of water that has occurred since utility works were carried out some time ago. A temporary repair using the wrong material was carried out and DCC have said that they have asked their contractor to remove the loose material and replace it with something more suitable. This is still, however, only a temporary solution.

All Councillors commented on the success of Christmas lights competitions in the parish and thanked those who took part for their efforts and displays. Cllr Chenore (MDDC) suggested that the Parish Council could each year nominate a community champion and this will be discussed at a future meeting.

Councillors resolved to make a grant of £200 to Mid Devon Mobility to assist in their work supporting residents throughout the Parish. Councillors also resolved to increase the precept by 3% to allow for increases in running costs, grant payments to charities that provide support in the Parish and new projects.

The next full Council meeting will be on Monday 4th March at Yeoford Community Hall. If you would like to read the full minutes of the January Parish Council meeting, they are on the PC website. Parish Voluntary Wildlife Warden

More gales, but the the mighty Rock oak stands firm on a cold calm day as I set off from Rock Cross into Woodland Head. Here thick holly hazel and oak hedges line the road. Sadly there is a derelict cottage but it has become a wildlife reserve. As I pass a robin sings from the chimney pot, a blue tit leaves from under the remains of the thatch and blackbirds are feasting on fallen apples in the back.

Here huge oaks sit close to cottages, were the oaks already there? I'd love to know more of the history of Woodland Head. I turn left and come back to Yeoford lane and turn right and head down to Enterlake.

I can see an old cider orchard mostly thick with brambles and a tall holly double sided hollow hedge under oaks. Large swathes of snowdrops will soon burst into flower here. Extra wide hollow hedges are an important habitat. A lot of hedgehogs and pipistrelle bats live and forage here, so please try to drive slowly past Enterlake Farm up to Woodland Head and Rock Farm.

The banks are already showing new growth. There are variegated lords and ladies and honesty and the trees are becoming more scarce. Now you can see for miles and a large flock of crows fills the skies. Some of the hedges are still to be cut, leaving stems seeds and dried leaves to provide a warm wildlife shelter. The thaw is here but the ice still lingers out from the trees. The open uplands makes for a hard life.

It's very quiet until I drop back down into Yeoford. Here early daffodils are in leaf and birdsong breaks out. The warmth of the trees and thick undergrowth in the edges protects its wild residents.

It's clear that both Yeoford and Woodland Head are sanctuaries for birds, bats and hedgehogs. Long may this continue to be so.

REPORTING A PROBLEM WITH ROADS TO DEVON COUNTY COUNCIL

All drivers will be aware that state of repair of roads in Crediton Hamlets Parish is appalling, with more and more potholes (or are they craters?) appearing. The lack of action by Devon County Council is exceedingly frustrating but please report potholes in the hope this makes a difference.

County Councillor Newsletter—January

The new year has seen a few very interesting meetings. The first was a masterclass on fostering. I am sure you will have seen adverts on television asking people to put themselves forward as foster carers. In Devon we have 561 young people being fostered. There is a mixture of in-house foster families and agency foster families, the latter costing twice as much as our in-house people. I would like to make a plea to you all. If you think you could foster a young person please contact me and I will put you in touch with the officers who will help with assessment, training, duties and allowances. There is also a scheme for emergency fostering where you just take on the young person for one or two nights before things are sorted out for them.

We had a very detailed meeting about budgeting for children's services. On the bright side it is fair to say that all areas will be receiving an increase in their budget up to 13%. The big question we always ask is will this be enough, only time will tell. It does seem that Devon County Council is one of those that receives rather less per pupil than many of the other counties in the country! There is a complicated government formula that works out how much direct grant each authority receives. One other fact that came out of the briefing was the number of elected home educated pupils which now tops 3000! They have minimal costs but I do wonder at the quality of their learning and the fact that they are not mixing with their peers very much.

Another positive from talking budgets was the chief financial officer was able to assure us that we are not in danger of "going bust", we will not be issuing a section 114 notice, which has happened to several large counties in the country.

The consultation on the 8 towns with pay&display proposals closed mid January. The officer responsible has assured me that results from the consultation will go to Cabinet on March 13th; I shall be attending this Cabinet meeting and will listen with great care and ask all the right questions on behalf of our town. The Liberal Democrats and I have drawn up a petition calling on county to abandon its pay&display proposals. I shall be taking it to Bow market on Saturday 27th and will be on Crediton High Street around 11 30 for one hour. We are planning to have several of us on Saturday 27th and the following Saturday 3rd of February, which is market day in Crediton. I shall be presenting the petition at Devon County's full council meeting on February 15th. I have a feeling that some of the other 8 towns will also be presenting petitions. It seems that all eight are against!



TACKLE THE WINTER BLUES BY SHARING YOUR MEMORIES

Do you feel a bit deflated in the new year? Maybe you miss the cheer and hustle associated with the festive season, feel wiped out or even underwhelmed after all the build-up. What better way to overcome the winter blues than by sharing your memories over a chat and a cup of tea?

The Reminiscence Project is an ongoing project run by Crediton Library which collects memories of people living, or who used to live, in Mid Devon. Volunteers visit people in their own homes or in the community to chat about their younger years, school, jobs, or anything else they might like to talk about.

The conversations are recorded and stored online in a digital collection. This is open to the public for all to access, whether they want to find out about how their local area has changed over the years, whether they'd like to know what it was like to live in a certain time period or whether they just enjoy hearing other people's stories.

Funded by the National Lottery Heritage Fund, this project has been made possible thanks to money raised by National Lottery players.
