

CREDITON HAMLETS PARISH COUNCIL

At the February Parish Council meeting Councillors discussed the offer of a gift of part of the parking area opposite Yeoford Chapel and the Chapel Cemetery. (The offer had been received from the Trustees of Yeoford Chapel). Councillors agreed that it is important for Yeoford that, to avoid parking on local roads, off road parking is available particularly for rail users. Councillors resolved to accept the offer.

The offer of a gift of the Chapel Cemetery was also discussed. Three Trustees of the Chapel were present at the meeting and they stated that the offer to gift part of the parking area was conditional upon the Council also taking over the Cemetery. In view of this Councillors resolved to accept the offer of a gift of the Cemetery.

Councillor Yarnold reported that the bus shelter was in place and thanked all who had helped with this project, including Cllr Letch for a donation from the Locality Fund and the organisers of Yeoford Fun Day for their sizeable donation.

Councillors thanked the Hittisleigh Parish Road Warden for helping a car driver and clearing a fallen tree in the Parish. Councillors discussed the benefits of a Parish Road Warden (eg filling potholes and clearing drains) and asked the Clerk to invite the Hittisleigh Road Warden to a future meeting to obtain more detail of his work and discuss whether the two parishes could work together.

The next full Council meeting will be on Monday 4th March at Yeoford Community Hall. It will be preceded by the 2024 Annual Parish Meeting, which will start at 7.15 pm. Parish Voluntary Wildlife Warden

It's a beautiful day as I leave the Chapel coffee morning and step out in the warm bright air. It's been very mild and all life is expectant of spring. The churchyard shows few signs of the glory of its wild flowers which includes rare orchids at present. Carefully nurtured wilder areas exist beyond the graves and the hedges here are some of the best I've seen in the Parish. Gentle chemical free care makes this one of best places for wildflowers.

Oak trees still dominate the edges of the village. In the playing field they jostle with mighty Scots pines. Blue and great tits sing loudly, along with robins and chaffinches and the increasingly rare house sparrows and under the trees wild wood spurge is growing.


I head down to the railway station. The banks of the path to the platform are covered in snowdrops, celendines and plumoria. It's a beautiful sight and a lifeline to emerging bees and insects.

Turning right before the platform a narrow path takes us along the river valley west. The River Troney is in full flow. With eyes closed I can hear a wren and with all the water gurgling and babbling, the modern world is lost, I'm in a place apart somewhere magical. And yet eyes wide open and here I am, tight to a railway line. I know kingfishers visit the Troney and so far I've not been lucky enough to see one and today was no exception. One day my kingfisher will come...

I reach Keymelford and leave the river behind and climb the hill to Brandise cross. The sound of water is replaced by sound of the wind. Trees are reduced to tiny pockets of oak holly and elder. Sadly the beautiful banks and tall hedges of the valley are gone. Vehicles have cut the banks hard and made them too steep. The hedges are barely discernable above the bank and soil slips are numerous.

Not all is gloom and doom on the downs. The big wide sky's have a beautiful song. Skylarks ascend singing on the wing. I checked and double checked, using the Merlin app. My ears didn't deceive me, there are skylarks. I can see scrubland in a tight combe in the distance that's ideal for these groundnesters. What a treat to hear them sing.

A rarer sight still of a DCC pothole crew passes me as I turn right at the barn and down to Neopardy. Here ferns seen since Keymelford, are in abundance. The deep cut lane is sheltered. The heat of the spring sun hits me as I emerge from its darkness. Before me lies the Yeo River and the Posbury Hills, my next destination. **Anna (artonmove@hotmail.com)**


County Councillor Newsletter—February

Very soon the dreaded envelope containing our council tax demands will be dropping on our doormat. All parties will have had to increase their demands because of cost of living, inflation, increased salaries and wages and cost of materials. The two highest tiers are required by law to set a “balanced budget” and so they have had to turn to making cuts in staff numbers and some non-statutory services.

At the full council meeting on 15th February I presented a petition on behalf of the Crediton area protesting against the proposal to introduce Pay & Display in our town. Following that I have been contacted by some other members of other towns involved. There are 8 towns where the proposals are being introduced. Tavistock town council have an online petition and members of that town's anti Pay & Display group are joining with some from Okehampton to go to protest outside County Hall on the 13th of March, which is the day when the Cabinet will be looking at the results of the consultation and making their decision. Their meeting starts at 10 30 AM. If anybody wishes to go along I suspect that the main party will gather about 9:30 AM. Placards are always useful if you have an artist in the family! They will allow a reasonable number of members of the public to attend the meeting in the chamber.

When I first moved to Crediton in 1998 there was a flourishing children's youth club. Later there was a “Sure Start” group which had a wonderful new building I opened as mayor. Imagine my surprise and horror when I discovered five years later that the building had been taken down and moved and the service had ceased. The youth club also suffered a similar fate. I'm pleased to report that Devon County Council are now looking to create an early help family hub. For Mid Devon the centre will be in Tiverton. This will accommodate the staff in the building where there is already a children's centre. The plan is to use outreach officers to make contact with the various youth clubs and schools in the towns and villages of Mid Devon. We have 3 youth clubs in Crediton but I'm not sure if there are any in any of the villages. If you know of a group would you please send me details of the leader so that I can put them in contact with the officers at Devon County Council? The idea is to set up a help and support service for those who have taken on the responsibility of creating a youth club in the area. There are over 18 thousand 0-18 year olds in Mid Devon.

At the moment I'm still only holding surgeries on Crediton Town Square on the first Saturday where I can hide under gazebos if the weather turns wet, and also in Bow on the fourth Saturday because the market is inside the village hall. I shall be going back out to my other villages in April when hopefully the weather will improve. In the meantime do not hesitate to contact me if you have any problems with which you think I might be able to help. Contact details as usual frank.letch@devon.gov.uk.


