Parish Voluntary Wildlife Warden

A misty damp morning finds me back in higher Neopardy where I take the footpath into field of last year's maize, a cover for pheasant feeders. It's clear that this feeds more than just pheasants. Nearby crows are nesting and their prints are visible, their caw caw calls fill the air.

The ground is very slippy and it's with relief I see the broken gate that leads into a hollow trackway. Now there are dry leaves under my feet, oak, elder, hazel, and holly trees wrap around me. I'm lost in old time, walking where ancients walked as the thatched roofs of Neopardy come into view. Their cob walls are pocked with solitary bee holes for their pupae. Deep eaves provide nest sites for housemartins. A lonicera hedge explodes with chatter and a host of house sparrows fly out. Once a common site these birds are now on the red list of endangered species in the UK. They are doing well here and in Yeoford thanks to the retention of hedges. We, in the Parish, are the guardians of their future.

I cross the Yeo River and the railway and turn left at the crossroads for Gunstone. Again skylarks are singing high above. When the grass grows a little longer they can begin to nest somewhere on these permanent pastures that flank the hills.

I take the footpath from Gunstone Mill up to Posbury and follow a babbling brook lined with ancient hawthorns up and up and up....It's so slippy and the rains come in and my hood goes up, I only see my feet struggling on in the mud until I reach Chalwell.

Here chaffinches and chiffchaffs sing in thickety old wooded copses. Dog mercury and primroses line the bank. I'm too tired to climb further so I take the footpath on the left, down past St Francis House to Venny Tedburn.

A large mature woodland beckons. A great spotted woodpecker hammers to a soundtrack of dripping leaves. Golden spurge peeks through lasts years fern leaves struggling to find light in the depths of the woods. As I emerge into the light on a fields edge it is sad to see 200m of wooded stream bank have been cut back to stumps, the banks scraped. One solitary birch survives.

I know there will be life here again. Seeds will be germinating under the increased light and soon new shoots will appear from the tree stumps. But it will take time and that's not what nature has right now.

I walk on in the mist. The stream gurgles and heads past an old orchard. I hope the old woods and orchard will be a sanctuary for creatures that have lost their streamside home. Too much hedgerow and trees have been lost in the parish. Each year more and more. I wish we could stop removing valuable habitats and start adding new ones.

An old oak who has seen so much more than me welcomes me to Venny Tedburn, the end of my walk. Next time I'm heading up to Oldridge, the eastern edge of the Parish.

At the Annual Parish meeting on 4th March the discussion was all about the state of the roads and potholes. Councillors and members of the public present expressed their dissatisfaction at DCC's failure to maintain the local roads so that they are in a safe condition for drivers. Further, when DCC does actually make a repair it is to a very poor standard, in some cases lasting only weeks. Cllr Letch (DCC) explained that DCC uses contractors (and sub contractors) for road repairs and that only 5% of repairs are inspected by DCC! Councillors confirmed that they and Cllr Letch do report issues (as do members of the public - see comments on the Yeoford Hub).

At the March Parish Council meeting Cllr Yarnold reported that the school $\frac{2}{3}$ bus has not been stopping at the new bus shelter in Yeoford as children's bus passes first need to be altered to show the new stop. He had contacted $\frac{2}{3}$ DCC and been waiting for some time for a response.

County Councillor Newsletter—March

Now that the council tax bills have arrived there is no need for speculation but rather to wait and see how the cuts impact on services. At a recent meeting of the County's Children's Scrutiny Committee where we looked at the huge SEND (Special Educational Needs & Disability) overspend. It is predicted that by April 2005 this figure will be about £207 million! The county council has been in consultation with the Department for Education and negotiated a Safety Valve agreement. This will not be a quick fix but will take six or seven years to bring down the overspend to 0. It is a three pronged attack on the problem with £98 million coming from central government over the next six years, money from Devon County Council taken from reserves and sales of assets and savings from the overall operation of children's care. I must admit that several people on the committee were rather sceptical about this final part of the solution.

Still on the theme of children I was delighted to attend a young carers webinar. I was staggered to learn that there are about 1 million children (under 17 years old) who have a variety of caring duties. We were treated to a presentation by six young carers to describe their challenges, the impact of caring on their own lives and possible solutions. There was a young carers action day earlier in the month. I would like people to look at the website www.carers/youngcarerscovenant, which you can sign. I'm going to press for this at district and county level. We are repeatedly told as councillors that we are corporate parents. I am hoping to turn this into something more concrete rather than just a few words.

Stagecoach and the county council have been in negotiations with central government for funding to help with zero carbon objectives. I'm pleased to say that Stagecoach has received £5.3 million which will enable them to introduce electric buses in North Devon, Torridge and Exeter.

Yesterday I attended a briefing from the two senior highways officers. The first thing they admitted is that they are overwhelmed by the number of defects and condition of our major roads. In the previous financial year they had fixed 40,000 safety defects (mostly potholes of course) but already this year which has a month to go the figure had jumped to 53,000. They have 20 gangs out repairing the safety defects who sometimes work at weekends in order to make an impact on the figures. The one thing they reiterated is that everybody from the senior highways officers down to any member of the public has the same power to report a safety defect. The computer system does not differentiate between highways officers, councillors and members of the public. There is also a section on the website for reporting gullies. You can check on each individual gully to see when it was last emptied. Guidelines are that those on the major roads are looked at monthly, other busy roads such as the A377 once a year, country roads again once a year and town roads once every three years. It is always helpful to go online to get an exact number of the gully so that the officers can easily go to the correct location.

I hope you all have a happy Easter and not too many April fool tricks played on you!

Drainage investigation works Road from Elston Meadow to Yeoford Village Cross

Monday 5th February 2024

Devon Highways will be carrying out drainage investigation works on the road from Elston Meadow to Yeoford Village Cross between Monday 8^{th} – Friday 12^{th} April 2024; the road will be closed during our working hours which will be 08.30 - 15.30. These works need to be done in advance of future resurfacing works.

Due to the nature of the works a road closure is required and the diversionary route for traffic will be signposted and advance signs will also be placed on the Highway. Emergency access will be maintained.

Please see the road closure and works area highlighted in red on the map below, there will be a signed diversion route which is shown on the map in blue. Drivers with local knowledge will be able to use alternative side roads but these will not be publicly advertised for safety.


