

Parish Voluntary Wildlife Warden

I met Simon Houldsworth from Devon County Council at the old punchbowl landfill site behind the recycling centre. It's not the sunny day we had imagined instead it's dull, windy and cold.

The landfill site closed in the 1990's, was capped and covered in a metre of topsoil. A thick border of native trees were planted, in the midst of which was planted a wildflower meadow. Regular monitoring and testing of the old landfill and local watercourses is undertaken by the staff. Simon lets me into the meadow and goes off to tidy a shed.

It's very beautiful. ox-eyed daisies, buttercups, purple vetch, knap weed, speedwell, birds foot trefoil, red clover and fleabane greet me, there is very little grass. The thin poor soil helps the flowers outcompete the grasses and it is very mossy. In the far corner high above, a single skylark sings it's beautiful song as the wind blows through the meadow. It should be warm, it should be humming with insects but save for the skylark it's silent and makes me sad.

Then I look down and notice a strange plant I've never seen it before, I reach for my glasses. It's an orchid, I look it up; a bee orchid. I spot another, then another, when I reach 50 I stop counting. There are hundreds of them, everywhere.

The flowers mimic a bee that does not live this far north; to lure in suitors which pollinates it. The orchids live as far south as the Mediterranean and this is their most northerly habitat. Here they self pollinate and flower rarely but when they do they can do so in abundance. Has the wet weather brought them into flower? The lack of fertilisers and weedkillers has certainly helped the fungus orchids rely on to grow and spread to establish here.

With a skylark clearly nesting on the far side who I don't want to disturb as they nest on the ground and not wishing to be an orchid crusher I head back. I stop to check out the hedgerow by the gate. Flattened grasses show small mammal movements into the meadow. The hedges here are thick and tall, ideal cover and shelter. A flash of dusky red reveals a freshly hatched cinnabar moth venturing out, the hedge sheltered it from the wind. Cinnabar moths rely on ragwort to raise its caterpillars. Over 30 insect species rely on ragwort to survive. I appreciate that horse owners and haymakers will remove this species for its toxicity but elsewhere you could just deadhead it as it finishes flowering to stop seeds spreading.

I head back to speak to Simon. He's excited to hear about the bee orchids which he's never seen before. We talk about the weather and the lack of early insects last year too. Last year the meadow wasn't cut until September to allow more time for the insects.

This place is very special and in a sea of intensive agriculture, a haven for our wildlife. Simon keeps visits onto the meadow and adjacent woods to a minimum. The area is safe from redevelopment. So now the most polluted land in our parish is now one of our most precious reserves. It has taken only 2 decades and thoughtful management to achieve. It gives nature the space and the peace it so desperately needs to survive.

Wild About Devon – Community Wildlife Grant Scheme 2024

Communities can apply for up to £500 to fund initiatives that support local wildlife and biodiversity. The Wild About Devon grant scheme recognises the vital role that community action can play in creating long-term benefits for wildlife.

A range of community wildlife projects and activities can be funded. This includes restoring neglected habitats such as grassland or woodland, creating new wildlife areas such as ponds and wildflower meadows or improving the management of parks and green spaces in a way that benefits wildlife.

All types of community groups with a wildlife focus or wildlife project, which are based in Devon (including Torbay) can apply for this grant. This includes community wildlife groups, Town/Parish councils, schools and Multi-Academy Trusts.

The maximum grant is £500, but the aim is to support more communities with smaller amounts of around £100 or less. Funds can be used for advice, equipment and other resources.

Wild About Devon has been developed by the Devon Local Nature Partnership and is financed by the

Devon Environment Foundation, Devon

Communities Together and Devon County Council.





County Councillor Newsletter—May

I recently received a quarterly bulletin from the NHS which has some encouraging news. The RD&E has undertaken a major review of its A&E resources. It says that this will improve times for those attending but insists that it is still an A&E Department and should not be used by those who can easily contact the telephone 111 service, use their local GP's surgery or a community pharmacy where they can get help and advice on simple health issues. There is also a plan to set up a specific children's A&E Department in the hospital. From January 2023 the RD &E was part of a pilot project using a blood test to detect early signs of lung cancer. The scheme was so successful it is now being used Devon wide! The local hospital in Tiverton is soon to have an endoscopy suite which will mean that patients in the Mid Devon area will have this important service closer to home.

I attended a children's scrutiny committee meeting where we discussed a wide range of topics. There is some progress towards the SEND (Special Educational Needs and Disabilities) over spend but it remains a major challenge. We now have fewer agency staff which means a cost reduction and the 14 authorities in the south-west are joining together in reducing the pay offered to agency workers. Fortunately the trade unions are on board. The number of children in the county's care has reduced from 906 to 877 and represents 66 per 100k, which is slightly higher than the national average of 62 but moving in the right direction.

The county is making a big push for more foster carers so that we can offer placements to our children nearer to home and in a family environment. One piece of less pleasing news is that we still have 17 unregistered, therefore unlawful accommodation placements but work is being undertaken to reduce this soon to 5 and I presume eventually to zero!

Last Thursday, 23rd May, we had the County Council full council meeting which is the beginning of the new civic year. That means a new leader and deputy leader and new chairman. Amongst other things I was elected the chairman of the Corporate Infrastructure and Regulatory Services scrutiny committee! It is quite a mouthful because it oversees everything the council does except children's services, health and adult care. I'm very excited at the thought of being able to look at so many areas of council activity. We have had one meeting and have already put in place a spotlight preview on potholes! It'll take all day and we will be questioning the highways officers to see where we have been and where we are going with potholes.

We also look at the budget on a regular basis and I'm hoping to look into communication and in particular Air Band, which we know, in the rural in particular, areas is rather patchy.
